Looking Back, Moving Forward

As we step into a new year, we take a moment to reflect on the incredible impact we've made together in 2024. It was a year of challenges and triumphs, and through your unwavering support, Hands of Hope Northwest continued to bring hope and health to communities both locally and globally.

In total, our Local Loan Program supported 1,157 families, distributing over 9,193 pieces of medical equipment. Meanwhile, through our Giveaway Program, we distributed mobility equipment worth over \$63,000, helping individuals regain independence and improve their quality of life. Beyond individual assistance, we worked closely with local clinics, homeless shelters, and educational institutions, providing much-needed medical supplies and equipment that strengthened healthcare systems and touched countless lives.

This impact wouldn't have been possible without our dedicated volunteers, generous donors, and supportive community. Together, we've built a network of compassion that stretches from Idaho to the far corners of the world, proving that when we come together, the power of hope is unstoppable. 2024 Highlights

This past year was full of accomplishments that reflect the heart of our mission:

- Locally: We provided 755 pieces of medical equipment through our Local Loan Program, valued at over \$70,000.
- Internationally: We shipped six 40-foot containers of medical supplies worth \$3 million to Ukraine and Guatemala, bringing aid to regions in critical need.
- Mission Trips: We supported 18 mission trips, providing supplies worth \$43,000 to teams making a difference worldwide.
- Local Clinics: We supplied over \$100,000 worth of medical equipment and supplies to clinics and organizations in Idaho, including new partnerships in Cambridge and Grangeville.



No Waiting, No Saving, No Stress

A woman had come to check out a knee walker and shower chair for her husband. I explained the process of checking out the knee walker and that she could keep the shower chair as long as she needed.

When she learned that the shower chair was a giveaway item she could take home that day, her entire demeanor changed. Her eyes welled up with tears, overwhelmed by the moment. She shared that she and her family had been trying to save up enough money to purchase a shower chair for their son, who has Cerebral Palsy. The family's resources had already been stretched thin by medical expenses and daily caregiving needs. The shower chair was one of those items that had been on their "when we can afford it" list. But now, in an unexpected act of kindness, the chair was hers — no waiting, no saving, no stress.

One of the highlights of the year was our new partnership with a clinic in Cambridge, ID, where we've been able to supply critical medical equipment to improve healthcare access in rural areas. Similarly, our collaboration with Syringa Hospital in Grangeville, ID has opened doors to assist healthcare providers in offering better care for their patients. These connections are more than just logistical achievements—they're lifelines to communities that depend on reliable medical resources.
