Breaking Records and Building Hope

The year isn't over yet, but we've already made history! Last year, our Gift-in-Kind donations reached just over \$3 million in value. By the end of October, we've already surpassed \$4 million worth of donations—a new record for Hands of Hope Northwest!

This incredible growth is a blessing, especially as requests for shipments have never been greater. We are working tirelessly to sort, pack, and send supplies as quickly as possible—but our capacity is overflowing so much that we had to rent another shipping container.

To keep up with the growing demand, we urgently need more volunteers and more space.

Currently, we're renting shipping containers to store completed pallets, unsorted donations, and equipment. However, with containers now encroaching on our parking area, it's clear that our warehouse can no longer contain the scale of our operations.

Our need to expand has never been greater. As our ability to serve—and the number of lives we can touch—continues to grow, we are determined to rise to the challenge. Together, we can ensure that every shipment, every box, and every piece of equipment continues to bring hope to those who need it most.

Local Loan Program Reaches New Heights!

Our Local Loan Program (LLP) has grown exponentially this year—and we couldn't be more excited to share the news! We've already surpassed last year's numbers, reaching nearly \$1 million in value saved for individuals and families through access to durable medical equipment.

This year, our program has stayed consistently busy from start to finish, a true reflection of the growing need in our community and the trust people have in Hands of Hope Northwest.

We want to extend a heartfelt thank you to everyone who



Giving Back in a Big Way


Our Give Away Program has flourished this year, helping us extend even more support to our local communities while reducing waste. Through this program, we've been able to give away more than 60 commodes, 100 bath chairs, 180 walkers, 215 rollators, 75 transport wheelchairs, and 80 canes—a total value of over \$67,000 returned to individuals and families in need across the Treasure Valley and beyond.

That's more than four tons of usable medical equipment saved from landfills and redirected to people who truly need them. Every piece represents renewed mobility, dignity, and independence for someone in our community. We're incredibly grateful to our donors, volunteers, and partners who make this kind of impact possible—turning excess into hope, one item at a time.
