Jony is a cheerful young man who enjoys watching television and spends most of his time in bed. His new wheelchair allows him to sit upright and enables family visits and walks around the community.



Diagnosed with Parkinson's disease three years ago, María quickly lost stability and balance. A wheelchair was provided to help her family move her, take her for walks, and accompany her to medical appointments.



Sebastián experiences leg weakness that makes walking difficult. He received crutches and a walker for added support and safety.



Mauricio sustained a spinal cord injury from a gunshot wound and had no way to get around. A wheelchair was donated so he can attend physical therapy.



María, affected by polio, received a custom-made pair of crutches to replace her worn, uneven ones.



Don Eduardo, once very active and dedicated to his cornfield, suffered a stroke. A wheelchair was given to restore his independence and mobility.



After suffering two serious falls in 2019 that fractured her femur and hip, Gregoria has struggled to walk. She received a wheelchair that will help her move more easily and attend church.



In 2015, Pascual was struck by a car, resulting in a spinal fracture. He received a wheelchair to improve his mobility and hopes to find work to continue supporting his family.



At age 20, Juan was kidnapped by soldiers who mistook him for a guerrilla fighter. He attributes his current illness to this trauma. His new wheelchair eases the difficulty of walking and allows his grandchildren to take him for walks.



Gabriel, a 10-year-old with cerebral palsy, received a wheelchair to facilitate mobility at school.

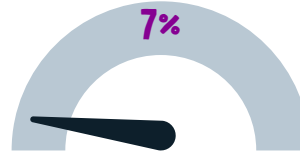

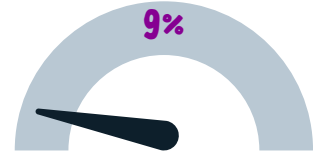
